Initial Appearance/Detention Hearing/Change of Plea Hearing/Bond Hearing	
Defendant appears on notice. Defendant present with counsel. Court summarizes the charges and advises Defendant of Rule 5 rights. Government does not seek detention and ask for standard conditions of release and a \$25k signature bond. Defendant does not oppose release. Government and Defendant agree to pretrial release. Court sets the following conditions for release: appear in court in accordance with all notices; travel restricted to the Middle District of Florida; reside at current address and cannot change address without PTS approval; surrender passport to PTS, cannot commit another crime; report to PTS as directed, \$25k signature bond. Due Process Oral order given. Plea Agreement filed. All parties appeared via Zoom. Defendant orally consents to hearing being conducted via ZOOM video conference. Defendant orally consents to the Magistrate Judge conducting this proceeding. Defendant orally consents to institute a presentence investigation report.	

Defendant sworn.

Defendant waives right to indictment and Grand Jury proceedings.

Court advises Defendant of rights and reviews Plea Agreement with Defendant.

Court finds Defendant competent to enter a plea of guilty.

Factual basis, as recited by the Government in court, is established.

Plea of guilty entered by Defendant as to Count One of the Information.

Court will issue a report and recommendation to the District Judge.

Adjudication of guilt deferred.

Referred to probation for presentence investigation.

Sentencing schedule to be determined.

Defendant directed to report to the USMS for processing.

Court in recess.
