Carla is not defined by this mistake. She is an astute businesswoman who has worked hard to make a decent living, always maintaining a professional appearance and

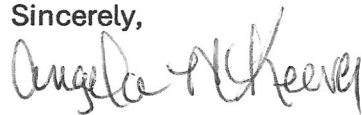
demeanor.

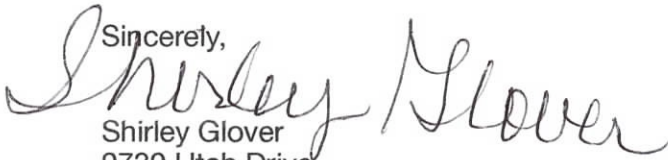
Greetings Judge Boulee,

Your honor, I implore you to see beyond this isolated incident and recognize the inherent goodness within my aunt.

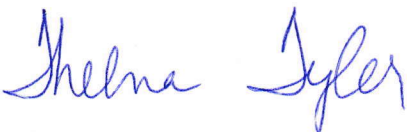
