**PROTECTIVE ORDER AUTHORIZING
THE DISCLOSURE OF PII AND SENSITIVE VICTIM INFORMATION**

THIS CAUSE came before the Court on the United States of America's Unopposed Motion for a Protective Order Authorizing the Disclosure of Personal Identification Information ("PII") and Sensitive Victim Information. Being fully advised, it is:

ORDERED AND ADJUDGED that the Motion is **GRANTED**.

The United States is authorized to disclose PII and sensitive victim information in its possession that the United States believes necessary to comply with its discovery obligations.

Defense counsel shall hold the discovery materials in strict confidence, disclosing such materials to counsel's client, staff, investigators, and witnesses only to the extent counsel believes is necessary to assist in the defense of this matter.

Defense counsel shall advise any person to whom the discovery materials are disclosed that, pursuant to this Protective Order, the information must be held in strict confidence and the recipient may not further disclose or disseminate the information without defense counsel's express consent.

Defense counsel shall obtain a written certification from each person to whom the discovery is disclosed, in which the recipient (1) must acknowledge these restrictions as set forth

in this Protective Order, and (2) must agree not to disclose or disseminate the information without counsel's express written consent. Counsel shall keep a copy of each certification to identify the individuals who received the discovery and the date on which such information was first disclosed.

Upon conclusion of the above captioned case, copies of the discovery disclosed to defense counsel pursuant to the terms of this Protective Order shall be destroyed or returned to the United States.

Nothing in this Protective Order shall preclude the parties from presenting redacted versions of the documents to witnesses and/or offering such documents as exhibits at trial.
