The biggest mistake I made Was to move to little rock I believe if we had stayed in west Memphis Maurice would have had a chance to go to college on a football scholarship and would have had a different outcome in life. But I moved him to little rock in a bad environment. I love my grandson and will provide all the support I can, he'll always have a home with me. I have some health problems I hope I live long enough to see him a free man. He has two daughters one 18 and one 13 he loves them and will do anything he could for them. He has called them and apologize to them for his mistakes, they loves their father also. I pray that you have some lenience on him and please ask the federal bureau of prisons to place him somewhere close to Little Rock Ar.so his family can visit him.
