NOTICE PURSUANT TO THE
DUE PROCESS PROTECTIONS ACT

Pursuant to the Due Process Protections Act, the Court confirms the United States' obligation to disclose to the defendant(s) all exculpatory evidence – that is, evidence that favors the defendant(s) or casts doubt on the United States' case, as required by *Brady v. Maryland*, 373 U.S. 83 (1963) and its progeny, and ORDERS the United States to do so. Failure to disclose exculpatory evidence in a timely manner may result in consequences, including, but not limited to, exclusion of evidence, adverse jury instructions, dismissal of charges, contempt proceedings, disciplinary action, or sanctions by the Court.
