PRELIMINARY ORDER OF FORFEITURE FOR PROCEEDS

THIS CAUSE comes before the Court upon the United States' Consent Motion for Preliminary Order of Forfeiture of Proceeds in the amount of \$20,832, pursuant to 18 U.S.C. § 981(a)(1)(C), 28 U.S.C. § 2461(c), and Fed. R. Crim. P. 32.2.(b)(2), which upon entry shall be a final order of forfeiture as to the defendant.

After being fully advised of the relevant facts, the Court finds that the United States has established that the defendant obtained \$20,832 as a result of the wire fraud offense in violation of 18 U.S.C. § 1343, as charged in Count Eight of the Indictment, to which she has pleaded guilty.

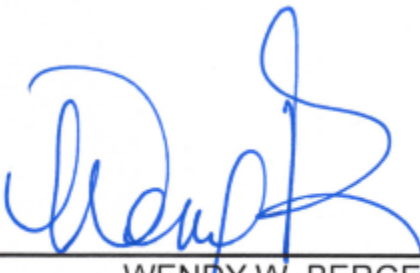
Accordingly, it is hereby:

ORDERED and **ADJUDGED** that for good cause shown, the United States' consent motion (Doc. 51) is **GRANTED**.

It is **FURTHER ORDERED** that the proceeds of the offense were transferred to third parties, and the United States cannot locate the proceeds upon the exercise of due diligence. Accordingly, under 21 U.S.C. § 853(p), as incorporated by 28 U.S.C. § 2461(c), the United States may seek, as a substitute asset in satisfaction of this judgment, forfeiture of any of the defendant's property up to the \$20,832 order of

forfeiture. The Court retains jurisdiction to enter any further order necessary for the forfeiture and disposition of any substitute asset.
