ORDER

This case is before the Court on the Magistrate Judge's Final Report and Recommendation that Movant Harrescia Hopkins's amended motion under 28 U.S.C. § 2255 to vacate, set aside, or correct sentence (Doc. 46) be denied. (Doc. 67.) A district judge has broad discretion to accept, reject, or modify a magistrate judge's proposed findings and recommendations. *United States v. Raddatz*, 447 U.S. 667, 680 (1980). No objections have been filed in response to the Magistrate Judge's Report and Recommendation. In accordance with 28 U.S.C. § 636(b)(1) and Rule 59 of the Federal Rules of Criminal Procedure, the Court has reviewed the Magistrate Judge's Report and Recommendation for clear error and finds none. The Court **ADOPTS** the Magistrate Judge's Report and Recommendation as the order of this Court. Accordingly, Movant's

amended 28 U.S.C. § 2255 motion (Doc. 46) is **DENIED**, and the original § 2255 motion (Doc. 44) is **DENIED AS MOOT**. A certificate of appealability is **DENIED** because Movant has not made a substantial showing of the denial of a constitutional right and resolution of the issues presented is not debatable. As no matters remain pending before the Court, the Clerk is **DIRECTED** to close civil action number 1:23-CV-3612-SEG-CMS.
