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SUPERVISED RELEASE

Upon release from imprisonment, you will be on supervised release for a term of: **three (3) years as to Count 9 and five (5) years as to Count 43, each count to run concurrently.**

MANDATORY CONDITIONS

1. You must not commit another federal, state or local crime.
2. You must not unlawfully possess a controlled substance.
3. You must refrain from any unlawful use of a controlled substance. You must submit to one drug test within 15 days of release from imprisonment and a maximum of 20 tests per year of supervision thereafter.

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STANDARD CONDITIONS OF SUPERVISION

As part of your supervised release, you must comply with the following standard conditions of supervision. These conditions are imposed because they establish the basic expectations for your behavior while on supervision and identify the minimum tools needed by probation officers to keep informed, report to the court about, and bring about improvements in your conduct and condition.

1. You must report to the probation office in the federal judicial district where you are authorized to reside within 72 hours of your release from imprisonment, unless the probation officer instructs you to report to a different probation office or within a different time frame.
2. After initially reporting to the probation office, you will receive instructions from the court or the probation officer about how and when you must report to the probation officer, and you must report to the probation officer as instructed.
3. You must not knowingly leave the federal judicial district where you are authorized to reside without first getting permission from the court or the probation officer.
4. You must answer truthfully the questions asked by your probation officer.
5. You must live at a place approved by the probation officer. If you plan to change where you live or anything about your living arrangements (such as the people you live with), you must notify the probation officer at least 10 days before the change. If notifying the probation officer in advance is not possible due to unanticipated circumstances, you must notify the probation officer within 72 hours of becoming aware of a change or expected change.
6. You must allow the probation officer to visit you at any time at your home or elsewhere, and you must permit the probation officer to take any items prohibited by the conditions of your supervision that he or she observes in plain view.
7. You must work full time (at least 30 hours per week) at a lawful type of employment, unless the probation officer excuses you from doing so. If you do not have full-time employment you must try to find full-time employment, unless the probation officer excuses you from doing so. If you plan to change where you work or anything about your work (such as your position or your job responsibilities), you must notify the probation officer at least 10 days before the change. If notifying the probation officer at least 10 days in advance is not possible due to unanticipated circumstances, you must notify the probation officer within 72 hours of becoming aware of a change or expected change.
8. You must not communicate or interact with someone you know is engaged in criminal activity. If you know someone has been convicted of a felony, you must not knowingly communicate or interact with that person without first getting the permission of the probation officer.
9. If you are arrested or questioned by a law enforcement officer, you must notify the probation officer within 72 hours.
10. You must not own, possess, or have access to a firearm, ammunition, destructive device, or dangerous weapon (i.e., anything that was designed, or was modified for, the specific purpose of causing bodily injury or death to another person such as nunchakus or tasers).
11. You must not act or make any agreement with a law enforcement agency to act as a confidential human source or informant without first getting the permission of the court.
12. If the probation officer determines that you pose a risk to another person (including an organization), the probation officer may, after obtaining Court approval, notify the person about the risk or require you to notify the person about the risk and you must comply with that instruction. The probation officer may contact the person and confirm that you have notified the person about the risk.
13. You must follow the instructions of the probation officer related to the conditions of supervision.

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SPECIAL CONDITIONS OF SUPERVISION

1. You must submit your person, property, house, residence, papers, [computers (as defined in 18 U.S.C. § 1030(e)(1)), other electronic communications or data storage devices or media,] or office, to a search conducted by a United States probation officer. Failure to submit to search may be grounds for revocation of release. You must warn any other occupants that the premises may be subject to searches pursuant to this condition. An officer may conduct a search pursuant to this condition only when reasonable suspicion exists that you have violated a condition of your supervision and that the areas to be searched contain evidence of this violation. Any search must be conducted at a reasonable time and in a reasonable manner.
2. You must not engage in an occupation, business, profession, or volunteer activity that would require or enable you to manage or handle money without the prior approval of the probation officer.
3. You must not be employed by any family member without prior permission of the probation officer.
4. Any business you operate during the term of supervision must be approved by the probation officer. You must operate under a formal, registered entity, and you must provide the probation officer with the name of the business entity and its registered agents. You must maintain business records and provide all business documentation and records as requested by the probation officer.
5. You must not cause or induce others to register a business entity on your behalf.
6. You must document all income and compensation generated or received from any source and must provide that information to the probation officer as requested.
7. You must provide the probation officer access to any requested financial information and authorize the release of any financial information.
8. You must not cause or induce anyone to conduct any financial transaction on your behalf or maintain funds on your behalf.
9. If the judgment imposes a financial penalty/restitution, you must pay the financial penalty/restitution in accordance with the Schedule of Payments sheet of this judgment. You must also notify the court of any changes in economic circumstances that might affect your ability to pay the financial penalty/restitution.
10. You must not incur new credit charges or open additional lines of credit without the approval of the probation officer, unless you are in compliance with the periodic payment obligations imposed pursuant to the Court's judgment and sentence.
11. You must provide the probation officer access to any requested financial information and authorize the release of any financial information until all financial obligations imposed by the court are paid in full.
12. You must apply any monies received from income tax refunds, lottery winnings, inheritances, judgments, and any anticipated or unexpected financial gains to the outstanding court-ordered financial obligation in this case.
13. If you have an outstanding financial obligation, the probation office may share any financial or employment documentation relevant to you with the Asset Recovery Division of the United States Attorney's Office to assist in the collection of the obligation.
14. You must comply with all legal obligations associated with the Colorado Department of Revenue and the Internal Revenue Service regarding federal and state income taxes. This includes resolution of any tax arrearages as well as continued compliance with federal and state laws regarding the filing of taxes.
